Dear Friends,

I have known of the existence of Underground Railroad for years, but have never personally known of anyone needing their services. After delivering clothing to the shelter, my daughter began volunteering there. Through her I got to know the needs, and what I could do to support URR and its clients. Now knowing most of the staff personally, I made it clear to them that I wanted to know what their needs were. This has been a win-win for both of us. When I am purchasing a large quantity of an item, clerks or customers often ask what I will do with the purchase. I very happily tell them it's for URR. I spread the word of shelter needs to anyone who will listen to me. The shelter is always full. This organization has been a Godsend for those in need of immediate assistance after leaving a bad situation. I am personally thankful for the shelter staff who lovingly serve their clients on a shoestring budget. It warms my heart to know that clients appreciate this sharing. After supplying food for a meal, a client wrote a thank you note which was given to me. I treasure it. The staff works miracles on a small budget. As I prepared well for retirement, God has guided me to share with those not as fortunate as myself. To perpetuate this sharing after I am gone, URR is part of my planned giving through an endowment fund at the Saginaw Community Foundation. I am happy to leave this legacy to URR and our community.


