## From the CEO 2018 YEAR IN REVIEW 10/1/2017-9/30/2018

Dear Friends,

Closing out my first year as Underground Railroad's Executive Director, I'm excited to share the news of our growth and development in the 2018 fiscal year.

The past year brought major renovations to our Safety & Resource Center which houses our emergency shelter and direct services staff. Capital projects included a new roof and air handlers, as well as a new boiler and control system throughout the building. These projects are crucial to our mission of providing safe and comfortable housing for victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking and human trafficking.

We also saw the expansion of our SafePlace program, a project that has doubled the number of safe and supervised visitations provided for families in our region. This year we also welcomed a new Housing Manager, and an additional Domestic Violence Advocate who will help the agency continue to provide the important services that remove barriers to achieving safety, empowerment, and change.

Finally, thanks to a generous grant from the Bay Area Community Foundation, Underground Railroad staff and board worked with the Community Action Network to overhaul our strategic plan for the next five years. Our outlined goals will continue our history of growth and innovative programming for survivors of abuse in Saginaw County. As responsible stewards of your investment in this work, we have ended the year financially strong. We are poised to carry out our strategic plan and deepen our impact in the years to come.

It continues to be an honor to grow together with you to serve this community, and work towards our mission to empower survivors and create a culture of safety and respect in our community.

Jennifer Wysong Independent Bank I was 25 years old, bartending in my small hometown, when I was sexually assaulted by my employer. Following the assault, I resigned from my job, began experiencing extreme bouts of depression and anxiety, and was struggling to perform everyday tasks. I withdrew from my friends and family, finding social interactions difficult and never knowing what might trigger a flashback. My relationship with my boyfriend was on the rocks, and he couldn't understand why I wasn't able to just "move on." As his frustration with me increased, he told me to find a therapist or he would leave.

I found Underground Railroad's free counseling services online, and finally called for more information. My therapist spent a lot of time getting to know me before we started talking about what happened. Once I felt like I could really trust her, I began to open up about the assault and other childhood traumas. For the first time in a long time, I felt hopeful about my future. I used that glimmer of hope as motivation to continue, and began meeting with my therapist for an hour or more each week. We used Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing (EMDR) to revisit traumatic events and reprocess the memories.

As I became more empowered, I found the tools necessary to leave my unhealthy relationship, develop new friendships, reprocess grief and loss, and actually begin to love myself. After 12 weeks of therapy, I felt strong again, and able to handle the other areas of my life that weren't perfect on my own. I felt a new sense of growth and excitement. My new self confidence pushed me to apply for my dream job at the Grand Canyon. Four weeks after leaving therapy, I got to call my therapist to tell her I was offered the position. Without the help of Underground Railroad I would have never dared to believe this dream could come true.
